Solid Waste & Recycling Program Guide

May 2011

The Town of Enfield provides solid waste services for Enfield residences via curbside pick-up of household waste, a drop-off service for recyclables, household waste and automotive waste, i.e. used oil & filters, at the Enfield Transfer Station and Recycling Center, seasonal yard waste disposal at the Enfield Public Works Facility and, in cooperation with regional facilities, collection of hazardous wastes, demolition debris, and other items.

Curbside Rubbish Pick-Up

Curbside pick-up of residential, general household waste, takes place one day per week for most households. Call the Town Manager's Office at 632-5026 if you don't know what your pick-up day is. Rubbish should be left at the curb in covered trash cans (32 gallon or less and no heavier than 50 pounds, loaded), no later than 7:00 a.m. the morning of scheduled pick-up.

Leaving rubbish overnight is discouraged, but if done, must be left in tightly sealed containers. You are responsible for cleaning up rubbish scattered by animals. Steel or plastic 55 gallon drums are not acceptable containers and will not be picked up. If you have a complaint, problem or suggestion, please call the Dept. of Public Works at 632-4605.



If you have a situation regarding pick-ups which require special attention or your rubbish was missed even though it was curbside by 7:00 a.m., call Northeast Waste Services at 1-800-248-7274.

BATTERIES — Mercury, NiCad and Lithium Rechargeable batteries. (Dry cell alkaline batteries are now made without harmful substances like mercury. Dispose of in regular household waste.)

Nicad batteries ONLY from cordless tools, appliances, camcorders, telephones, toothbrushes, etc. All should be recycled. Separate from other batteries. Cover contact area with electrical tape. See attendant if you have questions.



CORRUGATED CARDBOARD & BROWN PAPER BAGS —

All clean & dry brown corrugated cardboard. Break boxes down and flatten.

Keep clean and free of contaminants (oil, etc...) and remove plastic wrap. No waxed, dirty or wet cardboard. No light weight, gray or yellow "Asian" cardboard, or boxboard.

Fold brown paper bags neatly and place into one bag. Do not bundle with string.

GLASS — bottles and jars, glass & ceramic tableware, cookware, canning jars, vases, flower pots, mixing bowls, etc..., plate glass, mirror glass and incandescent light bulbs.



Rinse and remove caps. Metal or wood window or door frames must be removed from plate glass. No hazardous product containers or laboratory or medical waste glass. No TV tubes, computer monitors, automotive headlamps, windshields or other tempered glass.



CANS — Aluminum cans, steel/tin cans, empty aerosol cans, empty dry paint cans, aluminum foil & pie plates

All containers must be empty, free of product. Labels do not need to be removed. Plastic nozzles on aerosol cans do not need to be removed. No plastic caps. No rusty cans. Sorting cans before you arrive would be helpful.



MIXED PAPER, BOXBOARD & NEWSPAPER —

**NOW COMINGLED
NO NEED TO SEPARATE**

Mixed paper—Junk mail, magazines, catalogs, envelopes with or without cellophane windows, school paper (math paper, composition paper, construction paper), office paper (fax or photocopy paper, computer printouts, white ledger), real estate books, telephone books and NCR paper (no carbon required).

Boxboard—cereal, cracker, cookie, cake mix and cookie mix boxes, pasta boxes, shoe boxes, tissue boxes, paper towel and tissue cores, waxed paper boxes, plastic wrap boxes and aluminum foil boxes, shoe and shirt boxes, beer and soda boxes and paper egg cartons.

Newspaper—All DRY newsprint, including glossy or colored inserts.

AUTOMOTIVE FILTERS —

Drain oil out as much as possible.

AUTOMOTIVE BATTERIES —

Are now accepted at our Recycling Center.

OIL — Waste oil

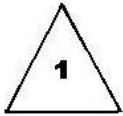
Motor oil, gear oils, and transmission and brake fluids only. Bring in clear or translucent plastic containers with lids, e.g. plastic milk jugs. Oil mixed with contaminating fluids like antifreeze and gasoline cannot be accepted.

Oil filters are also accepted

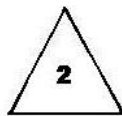
PLASTIC —



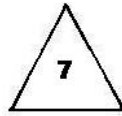
Look for the recycling triangle, generally found on the bottom of the item

COMPATIBLE WITH #2 HDPE

THESE SYMBOLS ARE ACCEPTABLE.

HDPE #2 & #7 Translucent milk, water and cider jugs, and colored plastic containers —

Translucent jugs with #2 on the bottom in recycling symbol. Juice jugs and colored detergent and shampoo bottles plastic containers with #2 or #7 on the bottom. Rinse and remove caps.

All jugs and bottles must have threaded, narrow necks and must have #2 or #7 symbol on the bottom. No other plastics regardless of the number on the bottom. No oil or anti-freeze containers.

PETE #1 bottles —

Clear and colored plastic bottles with PETE #1 on the bottom in recycling symbol. No other plastics regardless of number on the bottom. Rinse and remove caps.

FLUORESCENT LAMP TUBES — all sizes and shapes.

Store and package your bulbs in the original cardboard box, if possible. Broken or cracked bulbs are not recyclable.



SCRAP METAL — bicycles, lawn furniture, desks, fences, bed springs, metal shelving, etc...

Other acceptable items include: oil tanks or gas tanks, if cut in half and free of contents, mufflers and tailpipes, wire cable and metal strapping in clean steel drums, 55 gallon drums if tops are off and free of all fluid residue

If you have a large appliance please telephone the Transfer Station prior to transport to ensure we have room to take it (632-5208). See **Disposal of Special Materials** for instructions on Freon containing appliances like refrigerators, freezers & air conditioners.

Unacceptable items include: sealed containers of any kind, auto air bag canisters, tires (see Disposal of Special Materials), wood, paper, plastic, dirt, garbage, glass, parts and appliances from which oil flows or drips, machinery or engines containing oil of any kind, hydraulic hoses, wet or dry transformers, capacitors, or ballasts, and metal borings, turnings or shavings.

COMPUTER COMPONENTS, ELECTRONICS & TELEVISIONS —

No special preparation. Ask attendant about proper placement of these items at the Transfer Station & Recycling Center.

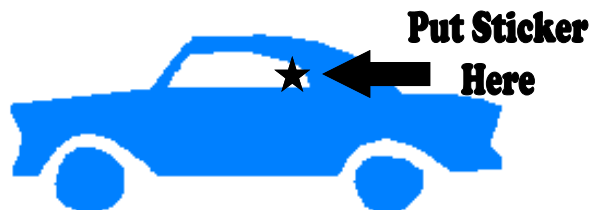

Permits and Weight Tickets

An Enfield vehicle permit must be affixed to the window of your car or truck—on the side window behind the driver's seat or, if this is not possible, another similar location which does not obstruct the driver's view in any way. Permit stickers can be obtained, free of charge, at the Enfield Town Office or the Transfer Station. Proof of residency or property ownership is required to obtain a permit. Enfield stickers also permit you to use the town beach parking lot on Mascoma Lake.

General household rubbish and certain other items may be taken directly to the Lebanon Landfill if you pre-purchase weight tickets. Lebanon Weight Tickets are available at the Enfield Town Office, Whitney Hall, 23 Main Street, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. and Thursdays until 7:00 p.m., OR at the Enfield Transfer Station and Recycling Center, 39 Lockehaven Road. Weight Tickets cost \$10.00. These tickets can be punched up to 10 times. Each punch is currently good for 29 pounds, but this is subject to change at any time. Cash and personal checks accepted. (Weight tickets are not sold at the Lebanon Landfill, but may be purchased at the Lebanon and West Lebanon Libraries or at Lebanon City Hall.)



Disposal of Special Materials



Freon containing appliances, like refrigerators, freezers, and air conditioners may be deposited at the Enfield Transfer Station for a \$20 fee (please have correct change). **Per State law, doors must be removed on all refrigerators and freezers prior to drop-off.**



Brush, leaves and branches up to 12" in diameter will be accepted at the Public Works Facility, 74 Lockehaven Road. **No stumps or dimensional lumber will be accepted.**

Hours: Monday—Thursday 7:00 AM—3:00 PM
Friday & Saturday 9:00 AM—3:00 PM. You **MUST** see a licensed attendant prior to dumping. On Fridays and Saturdays stop at the Transfer Station for inspection.



Tires: Enfield now accepts car and light truck tires! There is a charge of \$3.00 per tire or \$5.00 per pair. Tires must be removed from the rims.



Paint: Dispose of **Latex Paint** by allowing it to dry out completely. You can use kitty litter to speed the process. Dispose of dried latex paint in your trash. **Oil Paint** should be taken to the next **household hazardous waste collection**.

The following items cannot be disposed of via your curbside rubbish pick-up or at any of the Enfield solid waste facilities:



Bulky items, such as **mattresses, furniture and wood products:** Take directly to Lebanon. Weight tickets are required and cost is based on the weight of items.

Dead animals: Generally acceptable to bury on owner's property. Herds and certain other situations may require Health Officer (632-4343, ext. 5426) and veterinarian assistance.

Household hazardous wastes: Take to the next special hazardous waste collection. Store these materials in covered and sealed containers until collection day.

Examples of hazardous waste are degreasers, engine and radiator flushes, gasoline, herbicides, hobby chemicals, household cleaners, insect sprays, items containing mercury, non-recyclable paint, pesticides, photo chemicals, polishes, pool chemicals, rust preservatives, sealants, solvents, stains, transmission fluids, varnishes and wood strippers.

Construction/demolition debris:

Accepted at Lebanon Landfill. Must be from your home, non-commercial, and limited to 2-1/2 cubic yards per day. Weight tickets are required and cost is based on weight of items.

Hammond Grinding & Recycling in Canaan, NH can accept construction &, demolition debris, concrete, shingles, metals, stumps & brush at their Canaan facility. Call 523-4353 or visit their website <http://hammondgrinding.com> for more information.

Larger quantities of construction and demolition material can be taken to Hartford, VT. with special permit obtained at the Hartford Town Hall, Bridge Street, White River Jct., Vermont.
