AN ORDINANCE

REGULATING PARKING WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ENFIELD

SECTION II: No vehicle shall at any time be parked on any public or public maintained street, alley, roadway, or way open to the public in a manner which hinders or impedes the movement of traffic as defined in RSA 259:110 or hinders in any manner the proper maintenance of the way. The term maintenance includes plowing snow, grading, ditching, and attendance to utilities such as water and sewer lines.

SECTION II: There shall be no parking from 10:00 P.M. until 6:00 A.M. on any way as defined in RSA 259:125, with the exception of the so-called Whitney Hall parking lot, within the Town of Enfield.

SECTION III: Parking is prohibited:


- (A) On a sidewalk
- (B) On a crosswalk
- (C) Within an intersection
- (D) Within 30 feet of an intersection
- (E) At any place where signs prohibit parking
- (F) In front of a public or private driveway
- (G) In any public boat launching area except when engaged in the use or transportation of a licensed watercraft.
- (H) Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant
- (I) Within 30 feet upon the approach to any flashing signal, stop sign, or traffic control signal located on the side of a way
- (J) With the left wheels of the vehicle to the curb


SECTION IV: Law enforcement officers may move or have moved any vehicle in violation of this ordinance. Any costs occasioned in the removal and storage shall be the liability of the vehicle owner.


SECTION V: PENALTY. Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined \$5.00 for the first offense; \$15.00 for a second offense within a calendar year; and \$100.00 for a third offense within a calendar year. All fines shall be collected by the Town Clerk, Town of Enfield, New Hampshire.

SECTION VI: The adoption of this ordinance hereby supersedes and repeals prior Town Parking Ordinances.
