STATE AID GRANTS APPLIED TO DEBT SERVICE

The Town received State Aid Grant (SAG) funding for both the 2012 Route 4 Water & Sewer Extension Project and the 2016 NH Route 4A Sewer Extension Project serving Shaker Landing and Lakeview Condominiums. Each year that SAG funding is received, the Town will use the funds to pay down the loans and by doing so reduce the length of the loans.

NH Route 4A Sewer Extension (Shaker Landing & Lakeview Condos):

In 2020, \$50,335 was received for the NH Route 4A Project. The NH Route 4A project funding was provided by two loans: USDA and SRF (State Revolving Fund). The SAG award was based on original loan amounts: 57% SRF / 43% USDA. The \$50,335 received has been split by the same percentage to pay down the principal on these loans. This is good news for those property owners who are paying off these loans through sewer betterment assessments. By paying down the principal we are able to shorten the length of the loan. We are not able to adjust sewer betterment charges, however, since the semi-annual payments due will remain unchanged.

Route 4 Water & Sewer Extension Project: In 2020, \$25,360 was received for this project. The full amount has been used to pay down the principal on this loan. Annual loan payments will continue as scheduled, but the term of the loan will be shortened.

MUNICIPAL FACILITIES EVALUATION PROJECT UPDATES

On January 4th, the Board of Selectmen discussed next steps for the Municipal Facilities Advisory Committee's (MFAC) recommended new Public Safety Facility. The Board of Selectmen voted unanimously that there is a need to accomplish what the Committee has been working on, with support to the process and the facilities, but the Board does not support presenting in the Town Meeting 2021 as it needs to be postponed for at least one year.

Public forums and other opportunities for public engagement will be arranged over the coming year.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (CIP) COMMITTEE MEETING

Hearing #1: for replacement of Fire Department Engine 4 in the amount of \$600,000;

Hearing #2: to be held immediately following Hearing #1, for a capital lease (without escape clause) of a 10-wheel dump truck with plow package in the amount of \$195,000;

Hearing #3: to be held immediately following Hearing #2, for a capital lease (without escape clause) of a Police cruiser (\$47,000), Fire Department 'Car 1' (\$50,000) and Public Works F-350 (\$50,000) in the amount of \$147,000;

Hearing #4: to be held immediately following Hearing #3, for Public Works Facility building improvements in the amount of \$133,793;

Hearing #5: to be held immediately following Hearing #4, for improvements to the municipal water system in the amount of \$1,900,000;

Hearing #6: to be held immediately following Hearing #5, for improvements to the municipal sewer system in the amount of \$1,900,000.

All six hearings are relative to articles which will appear on the 2021 Town Meeting Warrant for vote at the second session (business meeting) of the 2021 Town Meeting.

Following the public hearings on bonds & notes over \$100,000, the Board of Selectmen will hold a public hearing to discuss the acceptance of grant funds in the amount of \$15,000 for Mascoma Lakeside Park improvements.

Please note that public hearings may start later, but not earlier, than the posted time.

TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The Town Meeting Warrant is not yet finalized. The last day to submit petitioned warrant articles is February 2nd. The Selectmen will be accepting qualifying petitioned warrant articles and discussing the final warrant at their February 2nd meeting. This meeting will be held via Zoom videoconference. 2021 BUDGET – PUBLIC BUDGET HEARING FEBRUARY 3RD

The Enfield Budget Committee has completed its preliminary deliberations to develop a proposed 2021 Budget for presentation at the Public Budget Hearing scheduled for February 3rd. The proposed budget is posted on the Town's website at <u>https://www.enfield.nh.us/budget-committee</u>. Following the public hearing, the Budget Committee will finalize its recommended 2021 Budget which will be presented for a vote at Town Meeting. POLLING PLACE

Due to COVID-19, in the interest of safety, voting for the November 2020 election was moved to the Enfield Community Building. The arrangement was highly successful. On January 19th, the Board of Selectmen and the Town Moderator discussed making this change in polling place effective for future ballot voting. By a unanimous vote of the Board future voting by ballot – for Town Meeting, state and federal elections – will take place at the Enfield Community Building, 308 US Route 4, Enfield.

TOWN MEETING

The 2021 Town Meeting will be held on two days as usual, but the second session has been delayed until May 1.

The first session is for voting by ballot for the election of Town Officers and any other questions required to be voted by Ballot. Polls will be open at 8:00 a.m. and close at 7:00 p.m. There will be no opportunity to vote by ballot on these Articles at the second session of the Town Meeting. After the polls close at 7:00 p.m., the ballots will be counted. You may vote by absentee ballot for the first session of the Town Meeting only.

The second session (business meeting) will be held outdoors. You must be present at this session to vote.

BUILDING, HEALTH & FIRE INSPECTION DEPARTMENTS

Winter Parking Ban

The Enfield Board of Selectmen wishes to remind citizens of Enfield that the Winter Parking Ban is in effect from November 1 through April 1. No vehicle shall at any time be parked on any public or publicly maintained street, alley, roadway or way open to the public, in a manner that hinders in any fashion the maintenance of the way.

Driveway Snow Placement

A reminder that it is unlawful to plow snow across any and all Town roads or to deposit snow within the traveled portion of a Town road pursuant to RSA 236:20, Paragraph VII, and RSA 41:11.

Driveway Sand

Driveway sand is available at the DPW during their business hours (Monday-Friday from 7:00 AM to 4:00 PM) and is located at the top of the driveway in the bin on the right. It is open to Enfield residents with a current Transfer Station Sticker. It is not intended for commercial applicators or to be taken in commercial volumes. Salt, ledge sand and materials in the shed are NOT available.

If you must be out on the roads, please drive safely!

LAND USE AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

The Zoning Board of Adjustment (ZBA) held no hearings in January. No hearings are scheduled for February either. The Planning Board (PB) held one hearing in January and had 2 conceptual discussions as well. CEMETERY DEPARTMENT

"KNOW YOUR TOWN"

The following is the second installment of "Know your Town" presented by the Enfield Heritage Commission. Each month we'll bring you a bit of insight into the origins of street names or places you see every day.

Main Street

Like several other things in our town, Enfield's Main Street owes its development to the Shakers and their dynamic leader Caleb Dyer. In 1847 Dyer convinced the Great Northern Railroad to change its plan for its route between Concord and White River Junction. Instead of following the western side of Lake Mascoma (the 4A corridor), it would pass through a cluster of houses and mills known as North Enfield. This kept the landscape and Shaker settlements on the lake's eastern shore from being disturbed but forced the Shakers to take a five-mile journey around the lake to reach the North Enfield railroad depot and businesses. Dyer led construction of the "Shaker bridge" across the narrow part of the lake in 1848. With three more bridges across the Mascoma River by 1849, the area between the Shaker bridge and the Canaan road (Route 4) became the economic center of the Enfield township.

North Enfield became known as "downtown" and its busy Main Street boomed. By the end of the 1800s, Main Street had mills, churches, hotels, blacksmith's shops, grocery shops, hardware, a jewelry store, an undertaker, a post office, carriage and harness shops. Forty houses were built in 1893 alone. In 1897 land was donated for Huse Park and the imposing Copeland block was built. The library was completed in 1901.

It did not last long. Decline began with the 1929 Crash and the Depression. Mills on the river and other businesses closed, leaving today's gaps. With foot traffic gone, cars took over.

Dolores Struckhoff, whose family owned a hotel on the site of George's grocery, remembers the early 1960s when Main Street was a "living breathing community with two grocery stores, Fogg's Hardware Store, Billy's (the local five and dime), the post office, Lucien's drug store, and the grain store." The sidewalks were filled with people, "running errands, greeting each other, stopping for chats, going about their lives as gas men, electricians, plumbers, painters, railroad employees, mill employees, grocers, postmen, pharmacist, clerks, waitresses, doctors, nurses, secretaries, teachers, or taking part in their hobbies around the river and lake." Since 2000, the Enfield Village Association has been working with New Hampshire's Main Street program to beautify and return to Enfield's Main Street to its former vitality.

• Community Building:

Due to the need to protect our citizens from undue exposure to the coronavirus all private functions scheduled at the Enfield Community Building are canceled, effective immediately (November 16, 2020) until further notice. No new reservations or applications are being accepted at this time.

• Enfield Punch Cards & Lebanon Punch Cards for trash disposal Payment for Enfield Punch Cards (\$25) and Lebanon Punch Cards (\$15) can be left in the drop box outside the Town Offices. Please include your name and mailing address and punch cards will be put in the mail at the end of the same business day.

ENFIELD COMMUNITY BUILDING

HIGH-SPEED/FIBER OPTIC CABLE INTERNET ACCESS

In recent months, an ad hoc committee comprised of local residents with interest and expertise in the telecommunications industry has been formed to identify and advance ways in which access to high-speed internet can be improved in the Town of Enfield. The Land Use & Community Development Administrator is serving as the staff lead on this effort. Although the NH FastRoads initiative resulted in a major build-out of



"middle mile" fiber optic cable throughout a majority of public roads in Enfield several years ago, the current owner of the fiber optic infrastructure (FirstLight) has signaled a lack of interest or willingness to connect new residential customers. Improving residential access to high-speed internet is essential for the Town of Enfield as it will help us attract and retain residents. The working group is exploring a variety of possible solutions, some of which may involve state or federal legislative active. Interested in learning more about this effort? The TIF Committee meets on an as needed basis, generally less than once a month, at the convenience of its members.

Or perhaps your interests lean toward Planning or Zoning. The Planning Board reviews and makes determinations on site plans and the **Planning Board presently has openings for alternate members**. Meetings of the Planning Board are on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month. The Zoning Board of Adjustment is a quasi-judicial body that has the responsibility for special exceptions and variances of the Town Zoning Ordinance. We have openings for **Zoning Board of Adjustment (ZBA) alternates**. Meetings of the ZBA are the second Tuesday of each month (as needed).

This group organizes our annual Old Home Days Celebration which takes place the last full weekend of July.
