Streetlights

The Selectboard voted not to remove any streetlights. They did send the list of broken lights to Liberty Utilities, which have been fixed. Perhaps the next recourse for removing any lights would be through the budget committee, who are trying to reduce costs. For now, we agreed to let this sit for awhile and look for an opportunity in the future.

NH Clean Energy letter

We received a letter from NH Clean Energy asking for us to support NH's net metering rules to increase the maximimum solar array size from 1MW to 5MW. Economies of scale will make this a better financial project and allow the state to grow the total solar generation. Kim made a motion that the Enfield Energy Committee support the letter from NH Clean Energy. It was seconded.

Discussion included bringing this up to the Selectboard to get their input in case they have any thoughts for or against it. The vote was unanimous to support and bring it before the Selectboard.

Everything is probably on hold for a while with the pandemic, which is going to affect the budgeting for a while. Chief Holland asked Kim about safety/reliability planning and the possibility of replacing a generator with battery backup. It is too expensive to do that now, but during the discussion of a new fire/safety building, it would make sense to think about solar and batteries to be able to increase resiliency.

Charlie checked with Jim Taylor about replacing the rest of the LED bulbs. We are waiting to get the go ahead to install when Covid issues let up.
