Enfield Land Use Case # P22-08-01, The Mirski 2008 Irrevocable Trust is seeking Boundary Line Adjustment (BLA) approval to simply split Tax Map 43, Lot 6 which is 1.20 acres, annexing half to each of the adjacent properties, resulting in two larger lots where there are now three. As a result of the annexations, Tax Map 43, Lot 5 (owned by the Mirski/Spencer Living Trust) will increase from 0.52± acre to 1.12± acres, and Tax Map 43, Lot 7-1 (owned by Daniel and Monique Bekele) from 0.83± acre to 1.43± acres. All properties are located on Algonquin Road in the R3 Residential District.
