## Solid Waste & Recycling Program Guide

The Town of Enfield provides solid waste services for Enfield residences via curbside pick-up of household waste and zero-sort recycling, a drop-off service for recyclables, household waste and automotive waste, i.e. used oil & filters, at the Enfield Transfer Station & Recycling Center, seasonal yard waste disposal at the Enfield Public Works Facility and, in cooperation with regional facilities, collection of hazardous wastes, demolition debris and other items.

### Curbside Rubbish & Zero-Sort Recycling Collection

Curbside pick-up of residential, general household waste and recycling takes place one day every other week for most households. If you don't know your pick-up day you can find it on the Town's website, along with more information about our Solid Waste & Recycling Program at [http://www.enfield.nh.us/Pages/EnfieldNH\\_Recycling/index](http://www.enfield.nh.us/Pages/EnfieldNH_Recycling/index) or call the Enfield Town Manager's Office at 632-5026. Rubbish must be left at the curb in Town provided trash and recycling containers only, no later than 7:00 AM the morning of your scheduled pick-up.

***Leaving rubbish overnight is discouraged. You are responsible for cleaning up rubbish scattered by animals. All non-Town provided containers are not acceptable containers and will not be picked up.***

**Accepting brush, leaves and branches up to 8" in diameter. NO stumps or dimensional lumber.** You MUST check in with the Public Works Department prior to dumping. On Fridays and Saturdays stop at the Transfer Station for inspection. (Stumps & branches greater than 8" in diameter can be disposed of at Hammond's in Canaan. Call 523-4353 for details.)

# How Recycling Gets Done™

Zero-Sort is the single bin recycling service that puts more of your stuff back into the world and less of it into the landfill.

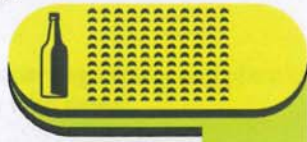
**It never leaves our sight:** Our state-of-the-art sorting facilities are located throughout the Northeast. From pickup to final processing, we make sure your recyclables take the shortest possible route from the bin to the shelves.

**It's just one bin:** No sorting on your end makes it easier to recycle more stuff more often. You just focus on filling the bin - we take care of the rest.

## How the Zero-Sort Machine Works

1. Material enters the first screen that breaks and removes **glass** bottles and jars.



2. Rotating discs push **cardboard** over the top while smaller material falls below.



3. Smaller disc screens separate **paper**.



4. An eddy current creates a reverse magnetic field that repels **aluminum** cans.



5. A magnet picks out **tin** cans.



6. Optical sorting technology sorts **plastics** into their different types.

# Zero-Sort® Recycling Guide

**Corrugated Cardboard:** Boxes with a wavy center layer.

- ✓ **Empty.** Staples, tape, and labels are OK.
- ⊗ **No oil, paint, or chemical stained, wet unclean, or wax-coated cardboard.** No strapping or string. No plastic, filmy or foam packing materials.

**Boxboard:** Cereal, shoe, and dry-food boxes, soda carries, paper egg cartons, tissue boxes, paper towel and toilet paper cores.

- ✓ **Empty.** Remove plastic liners.
- ⊗ **No Styrofoam cups.** No stuck-on food or grease.

**Envelopes & Mail:** White, colored, gummed, and window envelopes.

- ✓ **Remove non-paper enclosers.** (e.g., CDs, plastic cards, etc.) and strings. Labels are OK.
- ⊗ **No Tyvek or plastic envelopes.** No bubble wrap padded mailers.

**Magazines & Soft-Cover Books:**

Glue or staple-bound publications, paperback books, phone books, catalogs, etc.

- ✓ **Must be clean and dry.**
- ⊗ **No plastic wrapping, or CDs.**

**Newspaper:** All sections and inserts.

- ✓ **Must be clean and dry.** Remove from plastic bags. Do not tie with string.
- ⊗ **None** that are contaminated with food, paint, oil, pet waste, etc. No plastic bags.

**White & Colored Paper:** Copier paper, glossy flyers & brochures, file folders, craft paper, manila folders, index cards, construction paper, non-metallic wrapping paper, tissue paper & cards.

- ✓ **Must be clean and dry.** No need to remove plastic tabs, paper clips & metal hanging-file strips. Staples are also OK.
- ⊗ **No pressure-sensitive duplication forms.** No foil paper. No paper towels or facial tissue. No stickers or sticker backing material.

**Shredded Paper:** Confidential Documents.

- ✓ **Place in clear plastic bags and tie bag shut.**
- ⊗ **No shredded plastic (cards, etc.)**

**Plastics 1-7 & Rigid Plastics:**

Containers, bottles & jugs for foods, beverages, beauty, and cleaning products, detergents, dairy tubs (yogurt, sour cream, etc.) 5 gallon pails, laundry baskets, sleds, take-out containers, flower pots and trays, and frozen-food trays. Minimum size: 2" on any 2 sides.

- ✓ **Rinse clean.**
- ⊗ **No filmy or pliable plastic (grocery bags, bubble wrap, etc.).** No foam polystyrene (Styrofoam) products such as cups, take-out containers, packaging blocks and peanuts, etc. No housewares, office products, etc. No motor oil containers or electronics housing. No biodegradable plastics (PLA).

**Glass Bottles & Jars:**

- ✓ **Rinse clean.** Food and beverage containers only.
- ⊗ **No light bulbs, Pyrex, drinking glasses, window panes, or ceramics.**

**Aluminum Cans, foil, and plates:**

- ✓ **Rinse clean.**
- ⊗ **No stuck-on food or grease.**

**Metal Cans:**

- ✓ **Rinse clean.** Food and beverage cans only. Labels are OK. Can lids are OK placed inside the cans.
- ⊗ **No oil filters or scrap metal.**

## Permits & Weight Tickets

**An Enfield vehicle permit sticker must be affixed to the window of your car or truck** on the side window behind the front passenger's seat, or with regular cab pick-ups in the lower corner of the rear window behind the passenger. Permit stickers are available, free of charge, at the Enfield Transfer Station & Recycling Center or Enfield Town Offices. Proof of residency or property ownership is required. Enfield permit stickers also permit you to use the town beach parking lot on Mascoma Lake.

Weight Tickets are required for disposal of items at the Lebanon Landfill. Weight Tickets are available at the Enfield Town Offices, 23 Main Street, Monday-Friday, 8 AM-4 PM and Thursdays until 7 PM, OR at the Enfield Transfer Station & Recycling Center, 39 Lockhaven Road. Weight Tickets cost \$10 and can be punched up to 10 times. Each punch is currently good for 29 lbs., but this is subject to change at any time. Cash and personal checks accepted (made payable to "Town of Enfield"). (Weight Tickets are not sold at the Lebanon Landfill, but may be purchased at the Lebanon City Hall.)

## Accepted at the Enfield Transfer Station & Recycling Center

\*\* Some fees may apply. Please see Fee Schedule on last page of this Guide. \*\*

**Appliances:** Large appliances are accepted. Telephone the Transfer Station prior to transport to ensure we have room to take it (632-5208). Fees apply for appliances containing CFC's such as refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners—see fee schedule. **Per State law, doors must be removed on all refrigerators and freezers prior to drop-off.**

**Automotive Batteries:** Are now accepted at our Recycling Center

**Automotive Filters:** Drain oil out as much as possible

**Batteries: Mercury, NiCad and lithium rechargeable batteries.** (Dry cell alkaline batteries are now made without harmful substances like mercury. Dispose of in regular household waste.) NiCad batteries ONLY from cordless tools, appliances, camcorders, telephones, toothbrushes, etc. All should be recycled. Separate from other batteries. Cover contact area with electrical tape. See attendant if you have questions.

**Computer Components, Televisions & Electronics:** No special preparation. Ask attendant about proper placement of these items at the Transfer Station & Recycling Center. Fees apply—see fee schedule.

**Fluorescent Lamp Tubes:** All sizes and shapes. Store and package your bulbs in the original cardboard box, if possible. Broken or cracked bulbs are not recyclable.

**Oil: Waste oil**—motor oil, gear oils, transmission fluid and brake fluids only. Bring in clear or translucent plastic containers with lids, e.g. plastic milk jugs. Oil mixed with contaminating fluids like antifreeze and gasoline cannot be accepted. Oil filters are also accepted.

**Paint:** Dispose of **Latex Paint** by allowing it to dry out completely. You can use kitty litter to speed the process. Dispose of latex paint in your trash. **Oil Paint** should be taken to the next household hazardous waste collection.

**Scrap Metal:** Bicycles, lawn furniture, desks, fences, bed springs, metal shelving, etc. Other acceptable items include oil tanks or gas tanks if cut in half and free of contents, mufflers and tailpipes, wire cable and metal strapping in clean steel drums, 55 gallon drums if tops are off and free of all fluid residue.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS include sealed containers of any kind, auto air bag canisters, tires (see separate listing), wood, paper, plastic, dirt, garbage, glass, parts and appliances from which oil flows or drips, machinery or engines containing oil of any kind, hydraulic hoes, wet or dry transformers, capacitors, or ballasts, and metal borings, turnings or shavings.

**Tires:** Car, light truck and equipment tires are accepted. Tires must be removed from rims. Fees apply—see fee schedule.

### Disposal of Special Materials

**Bulky Items** such as mattresses, furniture and wood products: Not accepted curbside or at the Enfield Transfer Station & Recycling Center. Take directly to the Lebanon Landfill. Weight Tickets are required and cost is based on the weight of items.

**Dead Animals:** Generally acceptable to bury on owner's property. Herds and certain other situation may require Health Officer (632-4343 x 5426) and veterinarian assistance.

**Household Hazardous Wastes:** Take to the next special Household Hazardous Waste collection.

**Construction/Demolition Debris:** Not accepted curbside or at the Enfield Transfer Station & Recycling Center. Accepted at Lebanon Landfill. Must be from your home, non-commercial and limited to 2-1/2 cubic yards per day. Weight Tickets are required and cost is based on the weight of items.

Hammond Grinding & Recycling in Canaan, NH can accept construction & demolition debris, concrete, shingles, metals, stumps & brush . Call 523-4353 or visit their website at <http://hammondgrinding.com> for more information.

Larger quantities of construction and demolition material can be taken to Hartford, VT with special permit obtained at the Hartford Town Hall, Bridge Street, White River Jct., VT

**Paint:** Oil paint, varnishes, wood strippers, etc., should be taken to the next household hazardous waste collection.

Examples of hazardous wastes are pesticides & herbicides, antifreeze, dirty gasoline, mercury containing items such as thermostats & thermometers (mercury is silver, alcohol is red), household cleaners, polishes, pool chemicals, oil-based paint (not latex), varnishes, stains, paint removers, button batteries, rechargeable batteries, Ni-cad batteries and more.
