

Library Card Policy

The library offers its collection, public computers, and wireless access free of charge to all while physically in the library. No library card is required.

Resident library cardholders have **full** borrowing privileges, and their cards will expire after 3 years.* Anyone who meets one of the following criteria is eligible for a **Resident** card:

- A resident of or taxpayer to Enfield—must provide identification and proof of residence, such as a tax bill, rent receipt, driver's license, vehicle registration, etc.
- Enrolled at the Enfield Village School
- Employees of the Town of Enfield, Enfield Village School, or the Enfield Public Library—proof of employment required
- Enfield business owners—library card will be in the name of the business owner, and they will have responsibility for the card
- Children (under the age of 18) of residents or taxpayers in the town of Enfield. *A parent or guardian must be present to sign the library application form for any child under the age of 11.*

Full borrowing privileges include:

- Borrowing materials from the library
- Use of public computers
- Access to the free Wi-Fi
- Requesting materials via Interlibrary Loan
- Access to museum and other attraction passes
- Access to library programs
- Downloading books, audiobooks, movies, and music from online platforms (such as Kanopy, Libby, and Hoopla Digital)

Nonresidents, anyone who does not meet the **Resident** criteria, may apply for a library card with **limited** privileges. Applying for a **Nonresident** library card, requires identification, such as a driver's license or vehicle registration, and cards will expire after one year. *

Limited borrowing privileges include:

- Borrowing materials from the library
- Use of public computers
- Access to the free Wi-Fi
- Requesting materials via Interlibrary Loan
- Access to museum and other attraction passes
- Access to library programs

*Cardholders will be asked to verify current information to make sure everything is updated. In some cases, proof of residency may be required.
