MASCOMA LAKESIDE PARK FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN – NEW UPDATES!

Mascoma Lake is a treasured resource that should be available to all residents and visitors of the Enfield area, not just lake front property owners. Using donations,

gifts, grants and other sources of private funding (so that there will not be any impact on the tax rate), the Board of Selectmen and an associated subcommittee are actively pursuing acquisition of two lakefront parcels currently owned by NH DOT to further the objective of enhanced public access and enjoyment of the lake. These parcels are located adjacent to the underpass on Main Street with convenient access to the Rail Trail and the downtown area, and offer stunning views of Mascoma Lake.

NH DOT is in the process of commissioning its own staff appraisal of the property. Once that is completed, the matter will be referred to a legislative committee to determine who will be the next owner of the parcels. The Town has received indications from NH DOT that Enfield will be offered the opportunity to purchase the land at fair market value. It should be noted that in anticipation of a possible purchase of the land, the Town retained the services of an independent appraiser to appraise the properties in 2016. The findings of this appraisal will inform future negotiations on sale price.

The Enfield Board of Selectmen, as the Town's governing body, have decided to include an article of the annual Town Meeting warrant that would provide the authority to purchase the property and maintain it as a park, provided that the purchase price of the land and park improvements can be raised from private sources. The Board of Selectmen has formally established a trust fund where donations made in support of land acquisition and improvements for the Mascoma Lakeside Park property are now being deposited, and the Mascoma Lakeside Park Fundraising Committee has begun administering a fundraising campaign with the goal of raising \$500,000 (at least half of which the Committee is striving to raise over the next few months) to facilitate the purchase of the parcels and begin building a reserve that can be used for future improvements to the property. All donations are tax deductible. The Committee is very happy to report that, as of this printing, we are closing in on \$100,000 raised in the very early stages of the campaign. Initial progress toward the \$500,000 goal was helped in large part from a substantial matching gift that has been pledged by the Byrne Foundation. In accordance with state law, all gifts and donations will be returned to donating parties in the event the land purchase does not take place.

A public informational meeting regarding the Town's planned purchase of the property has been scheduled for February 26 (Monday) beginning at 7:00 PM in the Community Building. We strongly encourage interested residents to attend the presentation and take advantage of the opportunity to ask questions.

UPCOMING PUBLIC HEARINGS

On Tuesday, February 6, 2018, beginning at 6:30 PM in the Public Works Facility (74 Lockehaven Road) the Board of Selectmen will hold five Public Hearings on the below described topics. Hearings will be held in sequential order with each hearing beginning immediately following the conclusion of the prior hearing.

- Public Hearing #1: in accordance with RSA 33:8-a, regarding a Bond or Note over \$100,000 for a Capital Lease of Vehicles and Equipment for replacement Public Works dump truck and replacement Police cruiser;
- Public Hearing #2: in accordance with RSA 33:8-a, regarding a Bond or Note over \$100,000 for Crystal Lake Road Improvements (approx. \$58,000), Fire Station and Shedd Street Garage Furnace and Insulation Upgrades (approx. \$20,000), Huse Park Basketball Court Improvements (approx. \$15,000), Whitney Hall Parking Lot Resurfacing (approx. \$15,000), Transfer Station Office Trailer Replacement (approx. \$6,500) and Community Buildings Security/Locks Upgrades (approx. \$3,000) for a total bond amount up to \$117,500;
- Public Hearing #3: in accordance with RSA 31:19, regarding acceptance of donated funds in an amount greater than \$10,000 in support of the Mascoma Lakeside Park, for deposit into the Mascoma Lakeside Park Trust Fund;
- Public Hearing #4: in accordance with RSA 31:95-b, regarding acceptance of \$16,500 in Asset Management Planning Grant funds.
- Public Hearing #5: regarding a 2018 Town Meeting warrant article to transfer \$76,000 from the CIP Capital Reserve Fund to the Municipal Facilities, Maintenance and Equipment Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of funding from the Municipal Facilities CRF a Strategic Governance Study (approx. \$25,000) and the purchase and implementation of municipal finance and permitting software (approx. \$51,000).
- Hearings may start later, but not earlier than the posted time.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

Route 4A Sewer Extension Project Update

Kingsbury completed connection of the remaining Lakeview sewer service lines on January 29th and flows are currently being directed to the new pump station and being discharged off-site. The pump station is functioning as intended with minor electrical work remaining. Additional work is expected in the Route 4A sewer manholes over the next few weeks. Following completion of this manhole work Kingsbury is expected to shut down for the remaining winter months. Decommissioning of the existing wastewater systems at Lakeview, final restoration of Lakeview and Shaker Landing roadways, final restoration of lawns and grasses, and installation of the remaining finishes around the pump station will be completed in May, 2018.

Conkey Enterprises continues work on the Shaker Landing Pump Station replacement portion of this project under a separate contract. The majority of the force main line has been installed as well as 50% of the gravity sewer lines. The pump station structures have been installed. Conkey expects to install the remaining gravity sewer line and have their subcontractors begin work on the pump station components, which is expected to take 3-5 weeks depending on weather and receipt of materials. A winter shutdown will occur for this work once the new pump station is up and running. he natural access drive, restoration of lawns and grasses and decommissioning of the existing pump station is expected in May, 2018.



Alkaline batteries: Most non-rechargeable batteries (AA, AAA, C, D, and 9-volt) are trash in NH. If in doubt, just bring to collection. Tape 9-volt terminals before disposal. Ammunition and explosives: State Police at 271-3636.

hazardous to your health—don't even think about removing it yourself! Automotive batteries: Take to parts store for cash back or your transfer station Empty aerosol cans: Can be recycled with scrap metal. Talk to your town. Fluorescent lights: May be taken at your town facility. Check with your town. Food Co-ops and Home Depot take may take CFLs (spiral bulbs), not tubes. Latex paint: Use kitty litter, sawdust, or shredded paper to dry out latex paint, then throw in your trash. Empty, dry metal cans may be recycled as scrap metal at your recycling facility. If it says "clean up with soap and water," it's latex. Medicine: See www.twinstatesafemeds.com for police stations taking meds. Medical sharps: Place in a rigid container (e.g. detergent bottle), seal cap with duct tape, and label container with marker, "Sharps, not for recycling." Dispose of with regular trash by handing to a waste collector. See www.nh.gov/medsafety. Can drop off at Lebanon Police Station. Propane or helium tanks and fire extinguishers: Propane/helium tanks can be exchanged/refilled at a distributor; or contact town transfer station about empty tanks. Empty fire extinguishers can be recycled (NRRA takes from towns). Used motor oil: Take to town transfer station or a service station for recycling.

OFFICE OF THE TOWN CLERK & TAX COLLECTOR

It is with both excitement and trepidation that I have decided to retire as Town Clerk/Tax Collector, effective April 27th. I have very much enjoyed serving the people of Enfield for almost 34 years and look forward to some new adventures in life. Thank you all for all your support and encouragement over the years.

We are gearing up for our March Town Meeting. The ballot voting for elected officials and zoning amendments, as well as a question regarding allowing keno in the town, will be held on Tuesday, March 13th from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. in Whitney Hall. Please remember that a photo ID will be requested. The rest of the warrant articles will be discussed and voted on at the Saturday, March 17th continuation of the meeting, beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the Enfield Village School gym.

I'm pleased to report that the Town Clerk's office did just over \$1 million in receipts in 2017. This includes motor vehicle transactions, boat registrations, birth, death and marriage certificates, marriage licenses, and dog licenses!

The Tax Lien Procedure will be executed on May 16th. Any past due property tax, land use change tax, timber yield tax or excavation tax and past due water and sewer charges are subject to a lien. The lien is recorded at the Grafton County Registry of Deeds and the statutory interest increases from 12% to 18% APR. If a lien is not redeemed after two years the Town may acquire the property by Tax Deed, which divests the owner of any rights to the property.

Many of you have received your boat renewal notice from the State and it's your preference whether to do it by mail or here in our office. We do charge a boat agent fee of \$5.00 per boat, set by the State. Boats are registered on a calendar year basis.

When you come in to register your motor vehicle we are required by law to see your driver's license. A friend or family member may renew the registration for you if you give them a copy of your registration or your mail-in notice; then we need to see their driver's license. This is an effort to curb fraud in Motor Vehicle transactions.

If you sell or trade-in your vehicle and wish to use the plates on a newly acquired vehicle we must, by law, have the original registration from your old vehicle. An auto dealer may keep a photocopy of it but you need the original. There is a \$15.00 fee charged by the State for us to do a certified copy of the old registration, to then be used for the transfer of plates from one vehicle to another.

When you do transfer plates the new registration will only be for as long as the old registration was good for, usually through your next birthday month. If it is within 4 months we can renew the registration after the transfer is completed.

PLANNING & ZONING OFFICES

Planning Board Activity

The Planning Board had one meeting in January of 2018. At the meeting the following items were acted on:

• Final acceptance of the Conditions was granted for the Evenchance Subdivision. The developer is expected to begin site preparation work in the very near future.

- A driveway permit request was put before the Board for approval. The existing lot already has two driveways and was requesting a third. The Board approved the request. The applicant's request was due to limited access to his lot with the existing driveways.
- Amendments to the Zoning Ordinance were presented. These involved providing a better definition as to what types of buildings can be converted into one with an accessory dwelling unit. Manufactured Housing and condominiums and townhouses would be excluded from creating an accessory dwelling unit. Two other amendments would provide corrections to language in the ordinance. One of these pertains to abutter notices for voluntary mergers. By law, no notice is required. A second amendment relates to a description for setbacks in the Eastman Development that the Board believed was in need of updating. Since it is a residential subdivision in Enfield's Conservation District, the setbacks from waterways within the Eastman Development are being proposed for revision by the Planning Board to be consistent with those in other residential areas. Minor changes to the Sub-Division and Site Plan Review ordinances were also discussed.

The Planning Board has decided to hold one public hearing per month for action on new or continued business. This meeting will be scheduled for the 4th Wednesday of each month. The Planning Board's 2nd Wednesday meeting will be dedicated for other business items, such as working on the master plan.

BUILDING & FIRE INSPECTOR

With the start of a new year a few updates from the office of the Building and Fire Inspector.

- Building Permit fees were increased effective September 2017, be sure your calculating from this schedule prior to submitting.
- Permit copy to post is **green** this year, check last year's **red** copy as it may need to be renewed if the project is not completed.
- Most projects undertaken in the Town of Enfield will require a permit, a couple of exceptions are roofing and siding as long as structural features are not being changed or upgraded.
- All single and multi-family housing units are required to have smoke detectors, and in most cases C/O (carbon monoxide) detectors are required as well. We have seen many units without these. Most detectors

- have a 10 year life span, after that time they need to be replaced. If you need help to determine if units are required or should be replaced, please contact this office.
- Work on an escape plan and meeting place with your family in the event of a fire or emergency. The Fire Department continues to visit local schools, preschools and daycares bringing fire prevention information to this audience.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

Notice of Water and Sewer Rate Changes

On December 18, 2017, the Enfield Water & Sewer Commissioners (Board of Selectmen) voted to adjust water and sewer rates in accordance with the formal recommendations offered by the Town Manager and Public Works Director. The new rates are effective January 1, 2018 and will appear in the 2018 first quarter bills arriving in your mailbox the first week in April 2018.

The updated rate charge chart is included on the reverse side of this letter. Water consumption rates have been split into two separate rate classifications. The first category is customers consuming up to 9,999 gallons per quarter. Users in this classification will be charged \$2.00/1000 gallons. The second category is customers consuming 10,000 gallons or more per quarter. Users that fall within this classification will be charged \$2.50/1000 gallons (although it should be noted that the higher consumption charge will only apply to those gallons consumed over and above the 9,999 gallons/quarter billed at the \$2.00 rate). There is no change to the fixed rates with respect to water. The sewer consumption rate has been increased 10% on both classifications of consumption (the first class being up to 23,999 gallons/quarter and the second class being 24,000/quarter or greater). In addition, the fixed rates have been increased for the first time since 2007. Please consult the detailed rate charge chart being mailed to your home for a breakdown of these changes.

You will notice a column on the rate chart labeled "deficit reduction charge." This is a **temporary** 40% charge based on consumption that is designed to eliminate the existing operating deficit in the Sewer Fund (this is presently estimated to be approximately \$700,000) within a period of five years. Once the deficit is eliminated, the corresponding deficit reduction charge will be

removed from sewer bills. The deficit has been growing steadily for nearly a decade due to revenues not keeping pace with expenses. The primary growth of expense is wastewater treatment at the Lebanon wastewater treatment plant which accounts for nearly 70% of the total Sewer Department's yearly expenses.

The Water & Sewer Commissioners, Town Manager, and Department of Public Works are committed to keeping the Water and Sewer Departments financially sustainable while delivering quality water and sewer services for the future. Several new projects are underway that will help to control future costs, and this includes a thorough evaluation of alternative methods of treating Enfield's wastewater.

Changes to the Transfer Station Hours of Operation – Effective Jan. 1

The Board of Selectmen, Town Manager, department heads and other local officials are committed to identifying ways to minimize or reduce Town spending while at the same time sustaining the quality of municipal services offered to our residents and visitors.

As was reported in more detail in the December issue of the town newsletter, the Board of Selectmen recently voted to adjust the Transfer Station hours of operation. More specifically, the new hours will be as follows beginning January 1, 2018:

• Wednesday: 11:00AM-6:00PM

Thursday: ClosedFriday: Closed

Saturday: 8:00AM-4:00PMSunday: 8:00AM-4:00PM

Please Use Curbside Trash and Recycling Services

Trash and Zero Sort recycling collected at the Transfer Station cost the Town of Enfield significantly more per ton than trash and recycling collected curbside due to extra hauling charges. Trash collected at the Transfer Station costs

approximately \$30 per ton more than material collected curbside (when Transfer Station transportation fees are included). Zero-Sort recycling collected at the Transfer Station costs the Town over \$80 per ton more than recycling collected at curbside due to the extra hauling fees (when Transfer Station transportation fees are included).

Please Recycle to the Fullest Extent Possible

The Town's current contracted solid waste hauler, Casella, has produced a brochure that outlines the materials that can be recycled via the Zero-Sort program. This brochure can be accessed here:

Remember, recycling is not only socially and environmentally responsible, but it dramatically reduces the hauling fees incurred by the Town. At present, the Town pays Casella \$68.68 per ton for trash disposal and \$35 per ton for recyclables collected at the curb. That's a significant cost difference. Please do your part to help keep our solid waste expenses down (and keep property tax rates as low as possible in the process)!

Driveway Sand

Driveway sand is available at the DPW during their business hours (Monday-Friday from 7:00 AM to 4:00 PM) and is located at the top of the driveway in the bin on the right. It is open to Enfield residents with a current Transfer Station Stickers. It is not intended for commercial applicators or to be taken in commercial volumes. Salt and ledge sand is NOT available.

Winter Parking Ban

The Enfield Board of Selectmen wishes to remind citizens of Enfield that the Winter Parking Ban is in effect from November 1 through April 1. No vehicle shall at any time be parked on any public or publicly maintained street, alley, roadway or way open to the public, in a manner that hinders the maintenance of the way. We thank you for your help and cooperation in keeping our roads and parking areas safe for passage! Narcotics Investigations

The Enfield Police Department conducted several narcotics investigations in recent months. The cases focused on individuals selling heroin. These investigations are very complex and require a coordinated and regional response; we applied for a state grant to work with the Lebanon and Canaan Police Departments over the next year in an effort to reduce the flow of these deadly drugs into our communities. We continue to maintain a visible presence on the streets to prevent thefts. Most addicts spend anywhere from \$500-\$1000 per week on their drugs. Thefts are one of multiple ways they are able to support their habit. We also need your help. If you see someone or something suspicious please call us immediately.

Speeding

Complaints of speeding vehicles continue to be an issue. We have deployed our radar trailer as well as patrols to help bring attention to motorists speed. Most of the complaints take place on our neighborhood streets. Please be mindful of

your speed and respect your neighbors concerns.
