Perambulation Lebanon and Enfield

Agreeable to a previous appointment we Selectmen of Lebanon & Enfield met on the sixteenth of November at a post and stones being the Southeast corner of Lebanon and the Southwest corner of Enfield, for the purpose of preambulating [sic] the line between said Towns and renewing marks and bounds according to Law. Beginning at the aforesaid Post & Stones thence running North about 35° 27 East to a Cedar Post & Stones beign the Northeast corner of Lebanon and Northwest corner of Enfield and in said line have renewed the following described bounds (to wit) A Stone on the East side of road leading from the house formerly owned by Benj.- Wood to Union Meeting House in Enifeld thence to a Stone on the South Side of the road leading from the house formerly owned by Tho.^s Hough to the J.B. Sargent place thence to a stake and stones on the Southerly side of Stony Brook opposite the South end of Gove's Saw Mill, thence to a State and Stones on the North side of Stony Brook road about three rods from said road thence to a State and Stones on the Hill south of the House of the late Hiram Purmort thence to a State and Stones on the South side of Enfield Pond.
