

*Perambulation
Lebanon and Enfield*

Pursuant to a notice by the Selectmen of the town of Lebanon to the Selectmen of the town of Enfield, the undersigned met at the Southeast corner of Lebanon and Southwest corner of Enfield on the 9th day of October 1896. At 9 o'clock in the forenoon the time and place specified and proceeded to perambulate the lines between said towns and renew the marks and bounds thereof, and establish the same as follows:

Beginning at a post and stones standing in the Southeast corner of Lebanon and the Southwest corner of Enfield said post marked L and E thence north about 39° 30 East to a stone surrounded by other stones on the south side of the road leading from the E C (?) Borden place to the J. B. Sargent place thence same course to a stone with stones piled around on the hill opposite the Horton place now owned by H. A. Follensbee thence same course to a stake and stones on the East side of the Stony Brook road and about 3 rods from said road, thence same course to a stake and stones on the hill North of the house of Miner Purmort, thence same course to a stake and stones on the South side of Enfield pond and thence same course across said pond about one mite (?) and seventy rods to a split stake and heap of stones standing in the Northeast corner of Lebanon and Northwest corner of Enfield.
