Pursuant to notice, the undersigned, Selectmen of Lebanon and Enfield, met at the South East corner of Lebanon and the South West corner of Enfield at 8 o'clock, on the $3^{\text {d }}$ day of October 1917, the time and place specified and proceeded to perambulate the line between said towns and to renew the bounds of the same as follows:

Beginning at a granite post and stones in the South East corner of Lebanon and the South West corner of Enfield, said post marked L. \& E. and an iron pin in the top of said post thence North 34 ®-55’ East to a stone surrounded by other stones on the South side of the road leading from the E. C. Barden farm now occupied by Bliss Forbush to the B. F. McCallister farm in which bound is a stake marked 1910 by the side of which we placed an iron pipe;

Thence same course to a stone, with stones around it, on the hill opposite the Horton place, now owned by H. A. Follensbee, buildings burned, ... by an iron pipe.

Thence...of the bridge.
Thence, same course to a ... on opposite ... on the Northerly side of the ... back...
Thence, same course to a pile of stones in which we placed an iron pipe, standing on the hill Northerly from Henry Monast and abut 48 feet South West from a spruce tree.

Thence, same course over the hill to an iron pipe on the upper side of the road about 10 paces Northerly from the bridge on the road leading Southerly to Shaker village.

And thence same course across Mascoma Lake to a granite post marked ... North East corner of Lebanon and the North West corner of Enfield and bring the established corner of the four towns, Lebanon, Enfield, Canaan and Hanover, said bound stands near a board fence and a large Maple tree.
